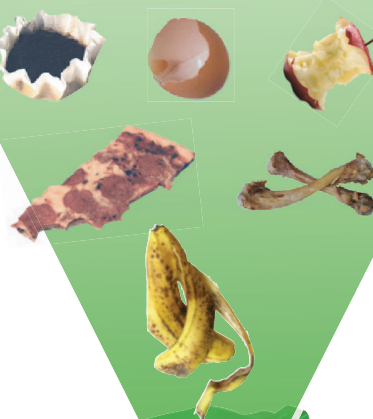

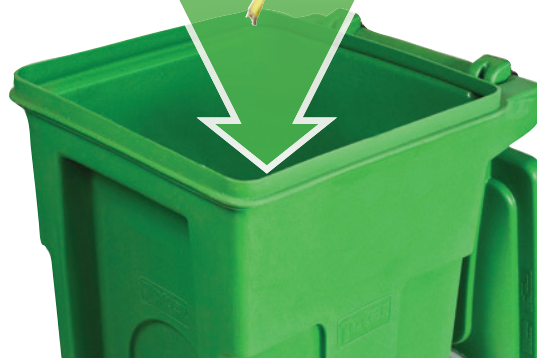

COMPOSTABLE ITEMS

Compostable containers

- ✓ Compostable to-go food containers and lids
- ✓ Compostable utensils
- ✓ Hot and cold compostable cups and lids
- ✓ Plastics labeled compostable

Food Scraps

- ✓ All fruits and vegetables (pits and shells too)
- ✓ Coffee grounds
- ✓ Dairy products (no liquids)
- ✓ Eggs and eggshells
- ✓ Food waste, leftovers and spoiled food
- ✓ Meat and seafood (including bones and shells)

Soiled Paper

- ✓ Pizza boxes
- ✓ Paper coffee filters and tea bags
- ✓ Paper bags, cups, and plates
- ✓ Paper napkins, tissues, and paper towels
- ✓ Paper milk and juice cartons (no foil liner)
- ✓ Wooden chopsticks, coffee stirrers, toothpicks

Other compostables

- ✓ Plant material like house plants, flowers, and leaves
- ✓ Hair, fur, or feathers (non-synthetic)
- ✓ Corks (no plastic)
- ✓ Cotton balls / cotton swabs

PLEASE **DO NOT** PUT THESE MATERIALS IN THE COMPOSTING BIN

Put these items in the **Recycling Bin**

- Clean and dry paper products: cardboard and mixed paper
- Glass beverage containers or food jars
- Hard plastics: plastic water bottles, laundry detergent or yogurt containers, and other plastics not labeled "compostable" or "biodegradable".
- Metal including aluminum foil, aluminum soda cans or soup cans

Put these items in the **Landfill Bin**

- Broken ceramic dishware and glassware
- Cat litter and animal feces (bagged)
- Chip bags, condiment packets, or food wrappers that crinkle
- Composite items made of multiple materials
- Diapers and feminine products
- Disposable protective face covering
- Foil/plastic-lined juice, soup, or soy milk cartons
- Plastic items mixed with metal, fabric, rubber or labeled "biodegradable"
- Plastic bags, film and bubble wrap
- Rubber or latex gloves
- Styrofoam, including food trays, packing peanuts and blocks, utensils, and Solo cups
